

THE CROWN CLASSIC

Two rounds · August 3–16 · one national board, lowest net wins. Keep this page — it has your code and the settings you'll need at the bay.

STEP 1 · DO THIS FIRST

Register with Back Nine

Go to beyondthegrass.com/register. This is the step that gives you your **indoor number, your flight and your tee** — without it you can play, but you won't be scored properly.

Men 60 or older? Tick the Senior box. That's how you get the Red tee, and nobody sets it for you. Women play Green either way.

STEP 2

Pay your entry at your Back Nine

You **pay your entry fee at your own Back Nine location** when you book your bay — ask them for their link if you haven't got one.

STEP 3 · DO THIS AT HOME, NOT AT THE BAY

Enter the Crown on Full Swing Compete

The golf itself runs on **Full Swing Compete** — a separate account from your Back Nine one. Do this from a computer or your phone **before you come in**, not standing at the bay.

1. Go straight to fscompete.com/event/3373. That's the Crown — no searching.
2. **Sign in.** Some entry points send you a one-time code, some ask for a password. Either is fine.
3. **Register on the event.** Having an account is **not** an entry.

Check the email on your Full Swing account matches the one you registered with at Back Nine. If the two don't match, your round doesn't find you.

STEP 4

Book two rounds, about two hours each

Any time between **August 3 and 16** — that's two weekends, so don't leave it to the last one. Book it the way you'd book any bay time.

STEP 5

At the bay — in this order

1. **Scan the QR** in the corner of the bay screen. That signs you in — with the account you already made.
2. Open **Full Swing Golf** on the bay screen.
3. Tap **Play**, then course selection.
4. Type **T–T–VJT** in the **FS Compete Event Code** box at the top.
5. Now the tee screen. **Code first, tee second.**

The code has to go in before your first shot. A round played without it never reaches us, and it cannot be added afterwards.

YOUR TEE

Assigned when you registered

Men play White. Women play Green. Senior men (60+) play Red. Senior women play Green — same tee both rounds. You don't choose it here; it was set at registration, so pick the one you were given.

STEP 6

Play it clean

Play every hole out — or pick up and take double par. The worst you can score on a hole is double par: 6 on a par 3, 8 on a par 4, 10 on a par 5. We apply that when we score your round. What records nothing is walking off a hole with no score at all.

If the sim stops reading your ball, tell whoever's working the room **and film it on your phone** — that video is what lets us fix your score. Without it, we're guessing.

THE SETTINGS — PRACTICE WITH THESE BEFORE YOU PLAY

Both rounds: 8-foot gimmies · soft greens · terrain penalty on.

Round 1: easy pins, medium green speed, windy. **Round 2:** hard pins, fast green speed, breezy.

Putting — stay behind the blue line. Putt from behind it; cross it and the sensors read your putt as a chip.

Mulligans — Round 1: take as many as you want, but **every one adds a stroke** to your Round 1 score. Three mulligans is +3. **Round 2: no mulligans at all** — they're switched off.

How you win. Two rounds on the TGL Season 1 holes, played at your own Back Nine on your own schedule. Every score from every location lands on **one national board**, scored on **net** through the Bridge — Back Nine's handicap method, so players of different abilities compete on one even footing. This is not a low-hitters' contest: you don't have to be the lowest handicap in the room to win. One field — every adult entrant, any gender, any tee, any handicap — and **the flights play too**. Scores are posted by the Back Nine team, so give the board a day. Entry is 18+; full eligibility at beyondthegrass.com/official-rules. Questions? Ask a Back Nine team member.
